CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

This report will be placed on the Club website together with any further reports not available at time when this report was prepared.

SECRETARIES ANNUAL REPORTS

(A) David Fickweiler - June to December 2010:

This is the last report I will prepare as your Secretary for, as many of you already know, I stood down at the end of December. I took the decision to stand down for a number of reasons the two main reasons being personal (in that I seemed to be enjoying less free time than I expected in my retirement), and my apparent failure to galvanise a few of the team managers to do all that was required of them, and the belief that perhaps a fresh face would encourage a change of attitudes amongst the few.

I somewhat reluctantly agreed to become Secretary in 1981 and during the years that followed I have seen the Club go through both good and bad times. In the past we managed to pull together during those bad times and became a stronger club as a result. I am not sure the same can be said of the present state of the Club. This is something that seriously needs to be addressed and I can only hope that my pessimistic view of the Club is not proved correct.

There is no doubt the continual delay in progressing our Ground Development has had an adverse effect on this Club, and the decision of Adur Council to cancel the proposed development of Adur Recreation Ground is yet another major setback. Personally, I believe the Council, both Officers and Members have conducted themselves in a disgraceful manner. They seem to have no regard to the fact that following the encouragement of both Officers and Members of the Council this Club has spent approximately £30,000 in preparing plans and developing the Club in order that we would be in a position to secure substantial funding. Further, those Officers and Members have paid no regard to the fact that the volunteers at this Club have over many years kept thousands of young person's off the streets by getting them involved with this Club.

Another major factor that has damaged this Club was the decision of the Football Association to employ as a full time coach our former Schools Liaison Officer Adrian Penrose. Whilst working for the Club Adrian was successful in building up the Girls Section and he also managed to recruit young players for the Club. Since Adrian left we have been unable to find a suitable replacement - and I can assure you that we have tried. We are again hopeful that we have found a suitable replacement but only time will tell.

Following my decision to stand down Mark Hilfiker agreed to take on the duties of General Secretary, with Perry Hart, Sarah Dyke and James Small taking on secretarial roles for the various leagues in which our teams play. I thank them all for their efforts on behalf of the Club.

Along with our Chairman Tony Ritchie and Michelle Ritchie, Perry Hart is standing down at this year's AGM and although Mark Hilfiker has agreed to carry on it is on the understanding that it is until a replacement can be found. It is, therefore, vitally important that volunteers are found to replace all vacancies.

The total number of games played by our teams (excluding Under 10s) totalled 232 of which 79 were won, 27 drawn and 126 lost. I do not have goals for and against.

During the season 16 players have been cautioned (11) or sent off (5) for offences they have allegedly committed on the field of play. Of these players 13 were from our senior teams and 3 from our youth teams. Unfortunately, in regard to Senior Team 1, in one game the official sent off 3 and cautioned a further 3 players and one has to question an official who issued so many cards in one game when taking into account the total number of players disciplined throughout the entire season. Needless to say there is nothing that can be done in regard to this official even though two senior leagues in the County will not allow him to officiate at any of their games.

All players concerned had their alleged misconduct referred to a discipline sub-committee and further action taken when considered necessary in accordance with laid down procedure.

According to the reports I received 15 of our players suffered from accidents or injuries whilst playing or training.

It is again disappointing to report we were unable to visit SV Orion this year. Team managers inform me they wish to continue with these exchanges and if that is so we should expect to receive a visit from SV Orion in May 2012. If their visit is a success then we would hope to visit Holland over the last weekend in May 2013 (Friday 24th to Tuesday 28th May).

These exchanges would not be possible without the support of host families and this is something we have to prepare for in 2012 if we are serious in our wish to maintain our friendship with SV Orion.

This club will continue to provide Public Liability Insurance for all of our teams up to a maximum of £10M, and of course personal accident insurance for all of our players. Details of the personal accident insurance will be passed to all Team Managers so that claims can be submitted without undue delay.

I would like to ask all members of this Club to read this report even those pages not involving the team you are involved with.

Despite the loss we incurred this season there are no proposals to increase member and match fees that will remain at: Seniors £45 Membership & £4 match; Youth & Girls £40 Membership and £3.50 match; Under 8/9s £35 Membership and £3 match. Providing all players pay their fees we should manage to live within our means and not have to rely on our cash reserves.

I would like to thank all members of the Management Committee, but in particular Paul Dunk, Sarah Dyke and James Small who have done that much more than most, and of course and all of our Team Managers and coaches. Without all of these volunteers there would be no Club and no football.

This club can only continue to grow with support of those persons who are always there to assist, the dads and mums who help with putting up goals and goal nets, with washing the kit, and collecting membership and match fees. We thank all of you who assist in making sure that we provide football for all in our local community.

Finally, I would like to pay tribute to Tony Ritchie who is standing as Chairman this year. Over the years Tony has been a hands on Chairman and worked hard in the background on behalf of this Club. He also produced our Club website. He has kindly offered to maintain the website and we are indebted to him. Tony's wife Michelle is also standing down as Children's Welfare Officer and we thank her for her efforts over the years.

I would ask all of you to support my nomination for Tony to be elected a Life Member of this Club.

TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT

I set before you, on pages 5 and 6, a Balance Sheet and Statement of Income & Expenditure for the year ending 30th April 2011.

I would ask for your support in adopting the accounts at the Annual General Meeting, and for the appointment of Independent Accountants Barrett & Company for a further year. I would also like to thank Barrett & Company for carrying out their task for last year free of charge.

Surprisingly, with fewer teams and players our income from both membership and match fees has increased this year due to better internal controls within the club. However there are match fees still outstanding for the year and managers concerned have been asked to pay these fees into the Club.

I am pleased to report that our two Senior Teams both produced a small surplus after payment of all their expenses. Unfortunately the same cannot be said of the Ladies Team that stopped playing half-way through the season and, to date, despite repeated requests we are still waiting for monies held by the manager of that team.

Whilst we have incurred a further loss this was less than Season 2009/10. It will be noted that administration costs have been further reduced and by continued 'good housekeeping' we should be able to break even, or produce a small surplus in the season ahead and, therefore, your Management Committee are not seeking to increase membership or match fees.

During the season the Club had to provide accounts and returns for HM Revenue & Customs who initially denied receiving the returns, and it was only when that Department was informed I retained proof of delivery they agreed the returns had been delivered as required. This is the first occasion on which it has been necessary to provide returns to this Department and I have requested that as this Club is a non-profit organisation that we be exempt from the need to provide returns in future.

1 The payments to SCFA in year 2009/10 include insurance, both Public Liability & Personal Accident for all of our players & officials.

RULES OF ADUR ATHLETIC FOOTBALL CLUB

Name & Constitution:

- 1(a) The Club shall be known as Adur Athletic Football Club.
- 1(b) The main purpose of the club is to provide facilities for, promote and encourage participation in the sport of football. The club is open to all on application without discrimination.
- 1(c) The majority of the playing members of the Club must, at all times, be resident within the area known as the Adur District.
- 1(d) The Club may also provide such social and other activities as may be considered by the Management Committee to be in the best interests of the Club and its members. All such social activities to be organised by the associated Club to be known as Adur Athletic Football Club Social Club.
- 1(e) The Club shall be affiliated to the Sussex County Football Association.

Officers & Team Managers:

- 2(a) The Officers of the Club shall be the President, Vice Presidents, Chairman, Vice Chairman, General Secretary, Secretaries with Responsibilities for League Administration, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Children's Welfare Officer, Fixtures & Referees Secretary, Social & Fund Raising Secretary, Volunteers Co-ordinator, Coaching Co-ordinator, Schools Liaison Officer, Kit & Equipment Officer, and Chairman of the Ground Development Sub-Committee. These Officers shall also be the Officers of Adur Athletic Football Club Social Club.
- 2(b) Any Officer, Team Manager or Committee Member having completed five (5) years' service to the Club shall be eligible for Life Membership subject to the approval of the Annual General Meeting. Life Members not holding office shall act in an advisory capacity and although able to attend ALL general meetings of the Club, shall not have any voting powers.

Management, Nominations & Elections:

- 3(a) The Club shall be governed by a Committee comprised of the Officers, Committee Members and/or Team Managers as determined by the Officers.
- 3(b) Retiring Officers and Team Managers shall be eligible for re-election without nomination. All other candidates seeking election as Officers or Team Managers shall be nominated in writing by two (2) members of the Club to the Secretary twenty eight (28) days prior to the Annual General Meeting. Names of those nominated shall be circulated in accordance with the notice of the Annual General Meeting. In the event of there being no nominations in accordance with the foregoing for any Office, etc., then nominations may be received at the Annual General Meeting.
- 3(c) The Management Committee shall meet as often as is necessary and shall deal with the business as it arises.
- 3(d) Life Members may attend the Management Committee meetings.
- 3(e) Except where otherwise mentioned all communications SHALL be addressed to the Secretary who shall conduct the correspondence of the Club and keep a records of its proceedings.
- 3(f) Any member of the Management Committee who is absent from three (3) consecutive meetings without reasonable excuse shall forfeit his/her seat on that Management Committee. This rule shall not apply to the President or Vice President(s).

Powers of the Management Committee:

- 4(a) The Management Committee may appoint an Emergency Committee, Social Committee, and/or such other Sub-Committee they may consider necessary and may delegate all, or any of their powers to such a Committee. The decisions of all such Committees shall be reported back to the Management Committee.
- 4(b) Each member of the Management Committee shall be entitled to one (1) vote on any particular matter. In the event of voting being equal on any matter the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 4(c) The Management Committee shall have the authority to apply, act upon, and enforce the Rules of the Club and shall have jurisdiction over all matters affecting the Club, including those not provided for by the Rules.
- 4(d) Four (4) members of the Management Committee, of whom two (2) shall be the Chairman, Secretary, and/or Treasurer, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 4(e) The Management Committee, as it may deem necessary, shall have the power to fill any vacancy that may occur amongst the members of that Committee.

Finances (Membership & Match Fees):

- 5(a) The financial affairs of the Club shall be administered by the Management Committee in the best interests of the Club;
 - (i) The financial year for the Club shall be from 1st May to 30th April;
 - (ii) The Club may hold accounts at such banks or other financial institutions as considered appropriate by the Management Committee;
 - (iii) All cheques issued on behalf of the Club shall bear the signatures of two (2) of the signatories, the signatories being the Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and Kit & Equipment Officer.
- 5(b) A signed copy of the duly audited balance sheet shall be sent to the Sussex County Football Association within fourteen (14) days of its adoption by the Annual General Meeting.
- 5(c) Each playing member of the Club shall pay an Annual Membership Fee as determined at the Annual General Meeting.
- 5(d) Each playing member of the Club, when participating in a match, shall pay a match fee as determined at the Annual General Meeting.
- 5(e) All items of expenditure must be approved by the Management Committee of the Club. Where necessary, the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer may approve expenditure on behalf of the Club, such expenditure to be brought to the attention of the Management Committee at the first opportunity.
- 5(f) The Club does not permit any distribution of club assets, in cash or in kind to members or third parties. This does not prevent donations by the Club to Charities or to other clubs that are registered as Community amateur sports clubs.

Child Protection & Discipline:

6(a) Players, Parents, Team Managers and Club Officials will at all times conduct themselves in accordance with the guidelines laid down in the Club Code of Conduct. Any person who fails to do so will be required to appear before a Disciplinary Sub-Committee and if found guilty will be dealt with in accordance with the punishments agreed at the start of each season.

Child Protection & Discipline:

6(b) The Management Committee shall have the power to expel any member whose conduct is considered detrimental to the best interests of the Club. The Management Committee may also take such disciplinary action as is considered necessary in the best interests of the Club.

Annual General Meeting:

7(a) The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held not later than 30th June in each year. At this meeting the following business shall be transacted:

- (i) The Minutes of the preceding Annual General Meeting confirmed, and business arising therefrom;
- (ii) Presentation and adoption of the Annual Reports, Balance Sheet and Statements of Account;
- (iii) Election of Officers and Team Managers;
- (iv) Alteration of Rules, if any;
- (v) Any Other Business.

7(b) Each member of the Club shall be entitled to one (1) vote only. In the case of junior playing members then their parent(s) or guardian(s) may speak on any matter but only one (1) such parent or guardian may vote in respect of one (1) junior playing member.

7(c) All voting shall be indicated by a show of hands unless a ballot be determined by at least one third of the members present.

7(d) Officers and Team Managers shall be entitled to attend and vote at all General Meetings.

7(e) In all cases where a vote is taken a simple majority shall decide. In the event of voting being equal the Chairman shall have the casting vote.

Extra-ordinary Meetings:

8(a) An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Club may be summoned by the Secretary at any time and must be convened within three (3) weeks of an:

- (i) Instruction from the Management Committee;
- (ii) Requisition signed by at least one third of the members of the Club clearly stating the purpose for which the meeting is demanded.

8(b) Seven (7) days notice of any such Extraordinary General Meeting must be given, in writing, by the Secretary.

Club Colours:

9 The colours of the Club shall be royal blue and white, or as otherwise determined by the Management Committee.

Team Managers (Selection of Teams & Club Property):

10(a) All matters appertaining to the training and coaching of players, the selection of teams, and the use of substitutes, shall be the responsibility of the respective Team Managers.

10(b) Team Managers will be responsible for maintaining a record of the team selected, including substitutes, and of all income and expenditure respecting the matches played by their team.

10(c) Team Managers will be allocated kit and equipment for the use of their teams for the playing of games and training. Managers shall have responsibility for taking care of all such kit and equipment and players should not be permitted access to that kit and equipment except when necessary for games or training organised by this Club.

Transfers:

11 Any playing member who wishes to transfer to another club during the playing season MUST inform his/her Team Manager and the Secretary of this Club without delay.

Awards

12(a) Any player who has played for a team or teams at this Club for a minimum period of 5 years, without a break, shall be eligible for a Loyalty Award. Similar awards may be made to those players who have played for teams for 10 years or more.

12(b) The Club reserves the right to withhold presentation of any award to a player who is in any way indebted to the Club, or for any other substantial reason determined at the discretion of the Management Committee whose decision shall be final.

Club Property:

13(a) A record shall be maintained of all property owned by the Club including property held by any Officer, Team Manager, or member in trust for the Club.

13(b) Any Officer or Team Manager who ceases to hold office, or any member who leaves the Club shall return to the Club without delay any property held by him/her on behalf of, or in the name of the Club.

13(c) Trophies presented to the Club, or won outright by any team representing the Club remain the property of the Club.

Complaints:

14 Any member, or members, desirous of making serious complaint(s) must do so IN WRITING to the Secretary who will submit such complaint(s) to the Management Committee for consideration and communicate the result to the complainant(s) within seven (7) days of the meeting of the Management Committee.

Ineligibility to Hold Office:

15 Any member holding office in any other football club will be considered ineligible to hold office within Adur Athletic Football Club unless his/her appointment is considered to be in the best interests of Adur Athletic Football Club.

Alteration to Rules:

16(a) Alterations shall only be made to these Rules at the Annual General Meeting, or at a General Meeting specially convened for the purpose and called in accordance with Rule 8.

16(b) Notice of the proposed alterations to be considered at the Annual General Meeting shall be submitted to the Secretary by 30th April.

16(c) Notice of such proposed alterations to the Rules shall be circulated with the Notice of the Annual General Meeting.

Dissolution:

17 In the event of the Club being dissolved, all net assets resulting from that dissolution shall be applied for approved sporting purposes to comply with the CASC legislation.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE GUIDANCE OF OFFICIALS, PLAYERS & PARENTS

1 What are our Aims?

- (i) To play to win fairly.
- (ii) To enjoy ourselves.
- (iii) To improve individual and team skills.
- (iv) To preserve the Club's good name through our good behaviour and sporting attitude.

2 Managers & Coaches.

- (i) Do respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person and treat each equally within the context of the sport.
- (ii) Do remember to place the well-being and safety of each player above all other considerations, including the development of performance.
- (iii) Do remember that at all times you must adhere to the guidelines laid down by the Rules of the Football Association.
- (iv) Do develop an appropriate working relationship with each player, based on mutual trust and respect.
- (v) Do not exert undue influence to obtain personal benefit or reward.
- (vi) Do encourage and guide players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance.
- (vii) Do ensure that the activities you demand of your players are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of your players.
- (viii) Do make sure that your players and parents understand what is expected of the players in your care, and what they can expect from you as their manager or coach.
- (ix) Do make sure that you co-operate fully with other specialists (e.g. other officials, doctors, etc.) in the best interests of your players.
- (x) Do make sure that you promote the positive aspects of the sport and never condone violations of the Laws of the Game.
- (xi) Do remember that you must, **AT ALL TIMES**, consistently display high standards of behaviour and appearance.

3 Do's and Don'ts (Players).

(A) Training Sessions:

- (i) Do your warm up exercise properly.
- (ii) Work honestly to improve fitness and skills.
- (iii) Concentrate and listen when your team manager or coach discusses previous matches, tactics and training exercises. Voice any constructive ideas you think will help your team or individual colleagues to play better.
- (iv) Bring the correct kit so you will be able to change for either indoor or outdoor sessions, wet or dry weather, warm or cold.

(B) Match Days:

- (i) Do arrive punctually. Lateness may result in last minute team changes or harm to the Club's good reputation.
- (ii) Make sure your boots are clean.
- (iii) You must have shin pads, and your shirt should be worn tucked into your shorts.
- (iv) Do get your mind on the game as soon as you arrive. Football is a physical contact game which requires each player to concentrate if he / she is to do his / her job properly.
- (v) Do make sure that you have your kit on at least 15 minutes before you are due to go out because your team manager or coach will want to go through the game plan with the whole team. PLEASE LISTEN.
- (vi) Do respect your opponents, never underestimate them, but, at the same time believe in yourself.

(C) During the Match:

- (i) Do warm up and stretch before kick-off.
- (ii) Do start as you mean to go on. Challenge for every ball in a hard but fair manner. Let the opposition know they are in for a tough game right from the first whistle. Do not allow your opponents time to settle.
- (iii) Do not moan at your own players when they make a mistake. Encourage each other.
- (iv) Do call for the ball if you are in a good position to receive it, but again, do not moan if you do not receive the pass. Your Team Captain, Manager or Coach will make appropriate comments. If substitute or substituted please listen to your Manager or Coach... the team consists of seven / fourteen players.

(v) Do not argue with the referee or his assistants.

- (vi) Do not try to referee the game by making constant appeals for throw-ins, corners, free kicks, etc.
- (vii) Do not lose your temper or retaliate if an opponent deliberately fouls you. Dirty play usually shows a lack of skill.
- (viii) Do not go over the top when your team scores by jumping all over each other. Just enjoy it.

(D) After the Game:

- (i) Do demonstrate a sporting spirit. Shake your opponents hands and thank them for the game.
- (ii) Do thank the referee. If they did not participate we would not be able to play. No referee – no game!
- (iii) Do continue to show respect for your opponents whether you have won or lost.
- (iv) Do think and talk about the match before the next training session when you will discuss the previous game.

(v) Do listen carefully to any comments made by your Manager or Coach about your performance. He / she will always offer you lots of encouragement and give you praise when you deserve it. However, your Manager or Coach may also make suggestions about how you might improve your performance and may, sometimes, constructively criticise one or two aspects of your play. Please do not take this criticism to heart as it is offered in the best spirit, and constructively, to make you a better player personally, and the team to play better collectively.

4 Do's and Don'ts (Parents & Supporters)

- (i) Do read advice given to the players so that you are fully conversant with what is required.
- (ii) Do support and encourage the players at every opportunity.
- (iii) Do conduct yourselves in such a way that your behaviour will always be a credit to the players and this Club.
- (iv) Do not argue with the decisions of referees and their assistants. If players see and hear their parents showing dissent then they will often follow the example set by you.
- (v) Do not issue instructions to players. The Manager or Coach will have given the players their instructions as to how they should play. Further 'advice and instructions' will only serve to confuse the players.
- (vi) Do not get involved in arguments with players or supporters from the opposition. This will only cause your players to lose concentration and discipline. It is better to walk away from an argument than to become involved in unpleasant incidents.
- (vii) If your child is unable to play do tell the Manager as soon as possible. Calling off matches at late notice may result in the team losing points and it reflects badly on the Club.

5 Discipline

Any player who is cautioned or sent off by a referee, or any official or parent whose child is a playing member of this Club and who is found guilty of misconduct will be required to appear before a Discipline Committee of this Club when additional penalties may be imposed.

6 Child Protection

- (ii) All Officers, Team Managers, Coaches and Assistants will be required to complete a Personal Disclosure Form in the knowledge that enquiries will be made to ascertain their suitability to have care and control of children and young persons.
